


Where did you grow-up? Where is home now?

The New Beginnings Program provides a safe, loving & home-like environment to a small number of children, ages 6-17, coming into the country as they start a new chapter of their lives. The majority of these youth come to this country unaccompanied, without their parents, when their home country is no longer a viable option for them to live safely. Our team of trained, experienced and educated staff provide a nurturing experience while a suitable sponsor or guardian is located and verified to ensure the youth will receive all the care they need after leaving our program.





COMPASS Programs make up the various services offered by D&M, each supporting young adults who are aging out of foster care. Our dedicated staff provide individualized support to each youth, meeting their specific needs and providing the tools & support needed to transition successfully into adulthood. Services include career/college readiness, Workforce Training Program, COMPASS Point Drop-in Center, Supportive Housing, peer mentoring, paid internships and more! COMPASS Point Drop-In Center is now open by appoitment only due to COVID-19 safety precautions .

MILES MILESTONE

Miles came to the D&M Transitional Housing Program (THP) in March of 2019. He was eager to make changes in his life but really didn't know where to start or who could help him. Fortunately for Miles, he found the Transitional Housing Program at D&M. The staff at D&M saw an eager young man and were happy to support him in his journey. The THP program provides an apartment with a roommate to help young adults by providing a stable living environment. These apartments are based throughout the community to help participants integrate. The THP program also provides regular meetings with a social worker and other supportive staff as needed to ensure participants can access the tools they need to thrive.

Once Miles was settled into his apartment he was eager to find a job and start his adult life. He met with his social worker and discussed his goals and made a plan. His social worker introduced him to the David & Margaret Employment Specialist who provide coaching and the tools for Miles to hone the skills need to be ready to get a job. A result of his hard work and follow-through Miles was hired full-time at a gas station. Miles' confidence and bank account have grown as a result of his first full-time job. Miles continues to build on his success and is now working with his social worker on a plan to enroll in community college. He is considering several vocational tracks and taking the time to make sure he chooses wisely. When asked about Miles, his social worker had this to say "Miles' hard work throughout his time in the program is shown by always being punctual when it comes to



weekly sessions and showing determination through his work. He is not only capable of living independently but is exceptional when it comes to making his needs known to the David and Margaret staff. I am very proud of all he has accomplished."

Make no mistake these accomplishments are huge for Miles! He has gone from being unhoused and unemployed to a young man preparing to go to college and build a successful career for himself. Miles is a contributing and valued member of our community! We can't wait to see all that he accomplishes!

Due to COVID, COMPASS Point Drop-In Center is now open by appointment only for those Transitional Age Youth (TAY) currently enrolled in David & Margaret Services. The drop-in center provides a warm and welcoming location for TAY to access services and have a safe space to spend some time. They are able to have a hot meal, take a shower, do laundry, access a computer lab, and work one-on-one with social workers and other support staff to address any challenges they may be facing. COMPASS Point drop-in center also brings together community resources and services so that TAY are easily able to access them.

FFA HOME STUDIES

David & Margaret Youth and Family Services Foster Care and Adoption Agency (D&M FFA) offers many services that are designed to support the entire process of fostering and adopting. The goal of any child in foster care is to reunify with their biological family and the at D&M that is the focus of our work. The well-being of the children who are placed in foster care will always be what drives the work we do. Making sure that the children have loving and stable homes while they are in foster care means we are always looking for potential foster parents and families that will provide that loving and supportive home.

While a majority of the children will be able to return to their biological families there are some for who that is not an option. For these children the D&M FFA will work to find them forever homes though adoption. While many families want babies we urge families to consider adopting older children as well. There are currently 55,000 children in the California Foster care system, with 20,000 of them in Los Angeles County. Of those over 3,200 are not able to reunite with their biological families and are waiting to be adopted. About 1,500 children are adopted in Los Angeles County annually according to the LA Times.

For individuals and couples wanting to become foster parents they must complete a training process before they move on to their home study. This is a process that begins with an orientation, you can learn more about this process on the D&M website.

Some children will be available for private adoption, children placed for adoption by their biological parents and not through the child welfare system. These adoptions are often facilitated by a lawyer or social services agency that specializes in private adoptions.

For any type of legal adoption within in California a home study is required. The social workers at David & Margaret are well versed in this process and able to provide a home study for any type of adoption (not just foster to adopt situation). Interested families may contact the FFA to schedule an appointment to complete their home study.

The social workers at David & Margaret are trained in the process and are there to be as supportive and helpful as you need. It can be a daunting experience to have some much of your life looked in to, but they are there to address any issues help you be successful in your goal of adopting. Because they have completed so many home studies they bring many ideas and suggestions and know how you are feeling. They will be with you through out the process and make sure all your questions are answered.

Amidst the COVID-19 pandemic, policies and procedures have been put in place to ensure the safety of our guests and staff. Every morning from 10am - 10:30 am Dave and Maggie's Center is open to patrons over the age of 55 and those with a compromised immune system only. During regular hours,

the Center is allowing 15 guests to shop in the store at a time, ensuring customers have the space they need to properly social distance. Plexiglass partitions have been installed at check-out and all employees are provided with equipment to maintain the safest and healthiest environment for our community. Staff is also frequently cleaning to ensure a safe environment for all. And finally, masks are required via county orders.
