

2014 Accomplishments

With your care, generosity and support in 2014, you helped make it possible to provide needed services to **1,115 clients**, including 407 males and 708 females up to age 30, through our various programs.

- 104 clients received **mental health services** and have gained skills to become more self-sufficient.
- 27 clients participated in our **Alcohol/Drug & Anger Management (ADAM)** classes supported in part by the City of Claremont, and reported gaining awareness of the dangers of abuse and making positive changes.

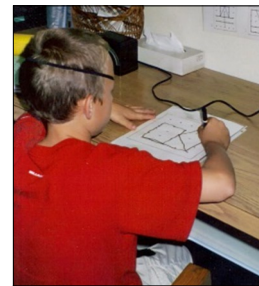

- 13 clients were matched with **mentors** who provide a positive role model, share their knowledge and expertise and introduce varied community events and experiences.

- 163 at-risk youth were provided **emergency shelter care**, and are safe from the dangers of abuse, exploitation and homelessness.
- 23 clients attended informational meetings, workshops and art therapy to learn how to **remain safe**, cope and how to avoid dangerous sexual exploitation.
- 36 participants in the **Transitional Living Program** are working toward independence, not homeless, and 100% of the participants are currently employed or in school.



Art therapy for victims of sexual exploitation

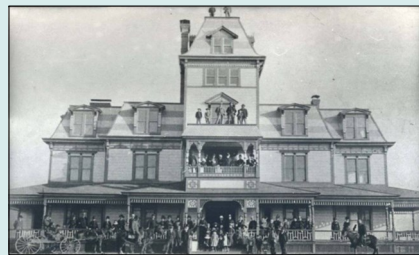

- 26 young women attended our **Joan Macy School** and have stabilized their educational experience.
- 39 clients received **Learning Enhancement Center (LEC)** assistance for their learning and processing difficulties.

About David & Margaret Youth and Family Services

- Established in 1910 as David & Margaret Home for Children by the Women's Home Missionary Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church, Southern California Conference. Land was donated by local businessman Henry Kuns; agency named after his parents and son.
- New dormitory built in 1925. It now houses administrative services and the Bargain Boutique.



- Cottages built beginning in 1960s to give residents a homier environment. Began specializing in care for adolescent girls, an underserved population.
- The non-public Joan Macy School opened in 1989. Currently serves both residents and students from surrounding districts.
- Agency changed name in 2007 to David & Margaret Youth and Family Services better reflect scope of services.
- Work began on 36-unit Cedar Springs Apartments and Youth Workforce Learning Center, both for transitional age youth, in late 2014. Slated to open in Spring 2016.

Selected Program Highlights

Residential: The remodel of Tarr Cottage was begun and will be finished in January 2015. The department also made many additions, changes and modifications to better serve our clients.

These include updating emergency manuals, adding to the number of walkie-talkies available to staff, implementing 'Seeking Safety' (an evidence-based practice for trauma and substance use) checks in groups, adding a life skills coordinator position, assigning therapists to cottages to improve collaboration of Mental Health Services and Residential, developing protocol for more formalized child/family team meetings, starting a monthly family day to increase caregivers' visitation with youth and provide opportunities for staff and caregivers to meet, and training residents in CPR and first aid.

Transitional Housing: The final steps were taken in preparation for a groundbreaking for construction of the 36-unit Cedar Springs Apartments and the Youth Workforce

Training Center, which will take place during Spring 2015. They will be located on the D&M property, separate but accessible to the rest of the agency.

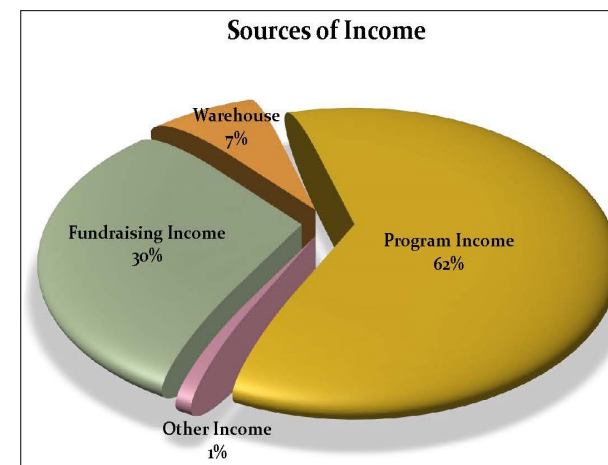
In cooperation with Development, the staff began structuring a new Youth Workforce Training Program, which will be a companion program to the Cedar Springs Apartments for transitional aged youth and low-income families needing supportive services. They recruited businesspeople in the community for both the planning committee and as participants working with the clients as lecturers, mentors and possible future employers.

Development: With the help of consultants, the department prepared the framework and written materials for the agency's upcoming Capital Campaign, which will kick off in early 2015. Prior to going communitywide, a special campaign event was held for employees in November to raise awareness and encourage participation. Together, Development and Resources raised a combined \$565,526 in monetary and in-kind donations for 2014.

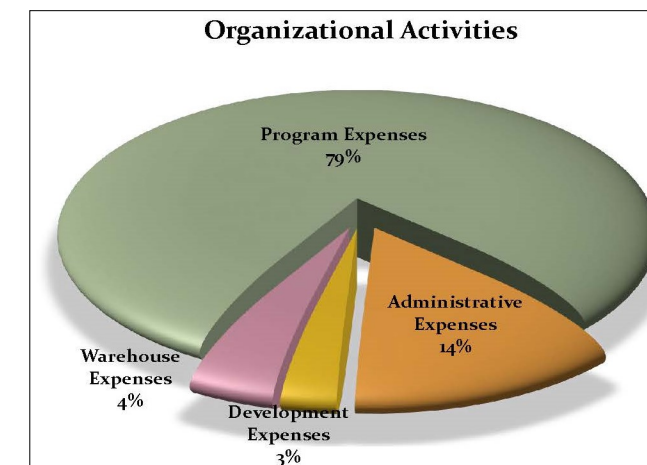
